The school has purchased access to **Encyclopaedia Britannica Online!** This gives pupils, parent(s)/carer(s) and teachers instant access to the unique encyclopaedia that offers high quality online learning and teaching materials developed by curriculum experts. This large knowledge resource also contains thousands of magazine and journal articles, teacher resources, videos, multimedia, interactive lessons, and thousands of images and illustrations that help bring subjects to life.

To access this resource, pupils, parent(s)/carer(s) and staff can simply login to our **virtual learning environment (VLE)** at <https://www.klp.rm.com> using their existing login details.

Once logged in to the VLE, click the '**SHARED SPACES**' tab, click the '**SHOW ALL SPACES**' button, and then click on the 'Encyclopaedia Britannica' link to gain access. The '**Britannica Student**' section is specifically for pupils in secondary education. Please contact the school if you have any questions.
