'Welcome to Your Vote' Workshop - MP Florence Eshalomi

On Friday 25th of January, we welcomed our local Labour MP Florence Eshalomi, Shadow Minister for Democracy for the UK who, along with the 'Welcome to Your Vote' initiative, spoke to our students about the importance of having a voice, having a say in how the country is run and crucially, how important it is to vote for what they believe in.

Our students had a myriad of questions for both Ms Eshalomi and the 'Welcome to Your Vote' team; they asked searching questions such as, how democracy works in reality and how best to engage in politics as young adults. Ms Eshalomi spoke about the current voting age in the UK and students discussed the pros and cons of the current voting system intelligently.
